### AMAZING SPORTING EVENTS!



It has been a successful term in sporting events. In December a group of KS2 pupils represented the school at Bushfield Ormiston Academy in the Panathlon Challenge taking part in 8 various target events coming 3rd place.

In November Years 3 & 4 boys enjoyed and progressed at a

football tournament festival at Stanground Academy School with some silky skills on show.

In October Year 5 & 6 girls took part in a girls only football festival at Jack Hunt School competing tremendously against 5 other schools.



There has been an increase in the number of children enjoying and participating in after school sports clubs with football club for years 1-6 on a Monday, dance for years 1-6 on a Tuesday and multi sports club for years 1-6 on a Wednesday. If your child would like to get involved in the New Year your child is very welcome with clubs running an hour after school.

In PE, reception have been learning ball skills, developing fundamental skills such as rolling, receiving, throwing, bouncing, catching and dribbling a ball with their feet. Improving fine and gross motor skills through a range of game play.

Years 1 and 2 children have been learning invasion games and ball skills, understanding principles of attacking, defending, how to score points and learning to play to the rules.

Years 3 and 4 have enjoyed playing handball, learning key skills such as throwing, catching, attacking and defending as well as playing by the rules.

Years 5 and 6 have been playing netball and hockey. They have performed a range of passes to keep possession as well as strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition as well as the importance of fair play and honesty while self managing games.
