# Mobile Phones and Apple Watches

If your child is in Year 5 or 6 and walks home alone, they may bring a mobile phone to school. If a child has a mobile in school we ask that, they hand it into the office upon arrival of the school gates and collect it at the end of the school day. If a child attends a sports club, they can collect their mobile phone at the end of the club from the school office.

#### <u>Autumn Disco</u>

The children will be having their Autumn Disco on the penultimate day before we break up. Please may I remind you that it can get easily congested when collecting and dropping off your child and so please bare this in mind and come early. We hope to see as many children as we can on the evening.

# <u>School uniform</u>

We are having a big push on school uniform, we would like to see all the children wearing the correct uniform which is:

- Red jumper or cardigan
- Grey or black trousers or skirt



- White top

We specifically have tried to make it easy and affordable for parents to get this uniform as it is universal and you should be able to pick it up from any local superstore. Attendance Matters: Children are considered compulsory school age from 1<sup>st</sup> September, or 1<sup>st</sup> January or 1<sup>st</sup> April following their 5<sup>th</sup> birthday. There is an expectation that all children come to school and arrive on time.
