CLASS NOTICES

Reading

All children will read for at least 10 minutes every day in school and we advise parents/guardians to listen to your child read at home for 10 minutes a day, at least 5 days a week. They will also be heard read by an adult at least once a week. Please ensure your child is reading a book appropriate for their level.

PE

PE will take place on Wednesdays and Fridays.

Children need to come to school in their PE Uniform:

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ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

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English	In English, we will be using both the class reading text 'Stormbreaker,' by Anthony Horowitz and 'Being Me,' by Liz Brownlee.https://www.goodreads.com/book/show/168472769-alex-rider-1-stormbreaker-by-anthony-horowitz?from_search=true&from_srp=true&qid=aPT70eQHzo&rank=2https://www.goodreads.com/book/show/57137087-being-me?from_search=true&from_srp=true&qid=ULO7j6TeQM&rank=1Click on this link to find out more information about the books stated above We will be writing a poem, explanatory text and narrative to inform.
Maths	In Maths, we will be looking at bar graphs, pie charts and other data sources. We will then be looking at different angles of shape as well as the properties of shape. We will be completing two revision weeks of mathematics in preparation for the SATs in week 5. Children should be using SATs Companion to revise any areas of maths that they need support with.
Science	In Science, we will be exploring Evolution and inheritance. In which, children will identify adaptations in plants, animals and humans as well as understand how adaptions made to suit environments may lead to evolution. Moreover, children will learn about they following significant individuals: Charles Darwin and Carl Linnaeus and their discoveries.
R.E.	In RE we will be learning about Christianity and Islam. We will focus on what makes a sacred place and how the Mosque in particular expresses Islamic beliefs and values. Additionally, we will be: exploring, listing and explaining similarities and differences between Muslim poetry and art.
History / Geography	Within History, children will be looking at decisions made by significant historical individuals and the impact they had. In Geography, we will be furthering our use of map work and looking at longitude and latitude, contour lines and map symbols.

ENRICHMENT AREAS OF LEARNING

Music	In Music, all the learning will be focused on the unit 'Music and Me,' where children will be listening and appraising songs from the Inspiration Women's timeline (Something helpful -Anna Meredith, VCA Moscow -Shiva Feshareki, Shades of Blue-Eska, The Middle Middle -Afrodeutsche). The children will continue to use the glockenspiels in their lessons, creating specific note patterns.
DT/Art	In DT, students will be designing and assembling a waistcoat which they will need to prepare (mark and cut) fabric for, to produce their final product. In Art, the children will be carrying out 10 minute sketch book activities.
P.E.	In PE, we are concentrating on Field and Striking skills within Rounders. This will include children developing their throwing, catching and bowling skills. They will also be developing their fielding techniques and how to apply tactics in a game.
Spanish	In Spanish, this term, we will be exploring seasonal activities to do in Spain with the aim to compare and respond to different travel blogs to express preference.
Computing	In computing this term, we will be learning about spreadsheets where children will modify spreadsheets, construct formulas and recognise that data can be calculated using different operations. We will also continue to look at online safety in every session.
